Embracing Our Responsibility as Stewards

Easter continues for fifty days until we mark Pentecost. Easter is not just a day but a liturgical season if you will. And within this season we celebrate God's creation in April. 
Dear Fellow Members;

Your bank can send a check for you to St. Luke

Did you know that most banks will support you in sending out payments? No envelopes, no stamps needed! If you have online access to your bank account, you likely can set up a one-time (or even recurring!) payment to St. Luke for your giving.

- Usually, the bank will only require the name and address of your payee. They will send, generate and mail a check or send an electronic funds transfer. (The bank typically takes care of obtaining any EFT information from the payee.) For St. Luke the address is 7001 Harford Road, Baltimore, MD 21234.
- The bank will ask for information to identify the payment to the recipient. Think of this as the "memo" line on your check. *Be sure to include your name and/or your envelope number in that field* for *our* recording purposes.

If you have any questions, the nice customer service folks at your bank will be glad to help you through the setup process.


